## Long Beach Transit Seeks Public Comment for Proposed Service Changes

Changing Transit Demand is the Source of Suggested Solutions

**LONG BEACH, CALIF. (August 20, 2009)** – Due to changing demand for transit services in Long Beach, Long Beach Transit is seeking feedback from the public on service changes that would add service to CSULB, downtown Long Beach, North Long Beach, the Artesia Blue Line Metro Station, and some parts of East Long Beach, where service does not currently exist.

The public is invited and encouraged to provide input on suggested changes that would fulfill these needs in the community. If these changes are approved by the Long Beach Transit Board of Directors, they would take effect Sunday, February 14, 2010.

According to Long Beach Transit Chief Operating Officer Guy Heston, "We are reaching out to the public in several ways so they have the opportunity to comment. These service enhancements, if well received by the public, would impact our customers, businesses and residents in the affected areas."
